- Has 2,048 residents (based on 2020 Census)

Important Announcements


Due to a rate increase from Econo Waste, the haul and removal charge for two or more garbage cans has been increased by \$3.50 per can. The increased rate will be reflected in your January utility bill

 Pursuant to Section 52-4-202 Utah Code Annotated, Willard City Corporation hereby gives its annual notice regarding meeting schedules for Calendar Year 2022.

 The Willard City Council will hold regular meetings on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month, excluding holidays. The meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. and will be held at the Willard City Hall, 80 West 50 South. All agenda items must be submitted to the City Recorder (435-734-9881, P.O. Box 593, Willard, UT 84340) by 12:00 p.m. the Friday prior to the meeting.

 The Willard City Planning Commission will hold regular meetings on the first and third Thursdays of each month, excluding holidays. The meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. and will also be held at the Willard City Hall.

 The Willard City Subdivision Land Use Authority (SLUA) will hold meetings as required. Meetings are usually held on Thursdays, excluding holidays, but can be held on other days if needed. Meetings will be held at the Willard City Hall. Agendas will be posted at least 24 hours prior to any meeting.

 All meetings, including any additional meetings, cancellations, or changes to the schedule, will be posted at the Willard City Hall and on the State of Utah Public Meeting Notice website (www.utah.gov/pmn).

DEPARTMENTS

Administration – Business licenses are now past due. A \$15.00 late fee will be charged for all 2022 business license renewals received after January 31st.

Approximately one-third of the City’s water meters have to be hand read. Due concern about meters freezing when exposed to cold air, water meters will not be manually read during the winter months. Some water accounts may show zero usage. Those accounts will receive a bill for minimum usage. When the weather warms up, meters will be opened and read. At that time, you may receive a ‘catch up’ bill if you have used more than 25,000 gallons of water per month.

Police A \$5.00 late fee will be charged for all 2022 dog license renewals received after January 31st.

Public Works – Public Works has street signs for private property owners on 200 West north of 750 North. The signs say ‘*Private Drive.*’ Private property owners can arrange to pick the signs up from the City. The signs must be installed by the property owner.

* Water meters are the property of the City. If you are installing a sprinkler system or need your water turned off at the meter for any reason, contact the City Office at 435-734-9881, or Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for after-hour emergencies. This avoids costly damage to the meter itself.
