2024 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY



The Utah Republican Part has decided **NOT** to hold a traditional primary election for President of the United States in 2024. Instead, they have opted to hold a 'presidential preference' vote by party members at neighborhood Republican caucus meetings, which will be hold on March 5th. If Utah Republicans want a say about their party's presidential nominations, they must attend those meetings. The Democratic Party in Utah will hold a traditional primary on March 5th. DEPARTMENTS

ADMIN - 2024 business license renewals are past due and subject to a 50% late fee.

Water bills are due on the 20th of each month. A \$5.00 late fee is added after the 25th. Water service will be shut off for all past due accounts.

<u>Water meters will not be manually read during the winter months. Our Public Works Director is concerned that exposing meters to cold temperatures could cause them to freeze. Water used over the 17,000 gallon per month base will be billed in the spring.</u>

POLICE – THANK YOU to all those that have taken the time to get your dogs registered. However, there are still A LOT of dogs that have not been registered. All dog licenses renewed after January 31st will be subject to a \$5.00 late fee. If you have a dog and do not register it with the City, you could potentially receive a citation. Willard City's ordinance requires ALL dogs over six months of age are required to be registered. Rabies vaccinations must be current to register. If you have any questions, you can call 435-734-9881 and ask for Lisa in the Police Department
