### Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget Highlights

On June 10, 2021, the City Council approved Willard City's 2021-2022 fiscal year budget totaling \$3,324,048 in all funds. The budget does not include a tax increase. The 2021-2022 budget can be found on the City's website and the Utah Public Notice website. The City has paid off its 2018 water bond. It has also purchased 10.67 east of East Park.
