Please bring your family, and come and see the Fire equipment. Learn about fire safety and medical safety. Play some games and enjoy some treats.

Since 1922, the NFPA has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in our country. During Fire Prevention Week, children, adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Firefighters provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires.

Fire Prevention Week is observed each year during the week of October 9th in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and caused devastating damage.

DEPARTMENTS

ADMIN – Our bank has asked that checks for water bills be written out to Willard City, not Willard Water Department.

On the City website you can sign up to receive a copy of the City's newsletter via email.

POLICE – PLEASE DO NOT leave your keys in your vehicles or leave them unlocked. Put items away. Don't leave purses, bags, electronics, coins, or personal information in your vehicle. Don't leave items in plain view. Lock garages, trailers, and storage sheds. Please report any suspicious activity in your neighborhood as soon as you notice it! The number to Box Elder County Dispatch is 435-734-3800 Option (0) for non-emergency calls. If it is an emergency call 911.

- The speed limit on all streets in Willard is 25 mph unless posted otherwise. Please slow down when coming down off of the east bench. School is back in session please watch for kids going to and coming home from school and around bus stops.

PUBLIC WORKS – Parks. The restrooms in the parks will be closed after October 24th.

Streets. Winter is approaching. Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for maintenance and snow plowing.

- **Water** – Water meters are the property of the City. Do not get into your meter box unless you are a licensed plumber. Please make sure your water meter is clear and accessible by trimming bushes and moving vehicles.
- **FIRE** - Burn Permits may be issued until October 15th. Dates are subject to change depending on the weather. Contact the Box Elder County Fire Marshall for open burn regulations and a permit.

Training sessions range from PERSONAL PREPAREDNESS to a wide variety of FAMILY, NEIGHBORHOOD and COMMUNITY readiness. We encourage every household to have at least one CERT trained family member. And one CPR/AED Trained family member.

All classes are held at Willard City Office Building 80 West 50 South.

The cost is \$10 per person. Classes will be offered in-person only this year.
