CITY CLEAN-UP

April 16-22 - City Clean-up The City-wide clean-up will be held April 16-22. Dumpsters will be located in the parking lot between the City Hall and the Fire Station. There will be a trailer for metals and batteries. We will NOT have an area for electronics this year. This is a service to the residents of Willard and to continue we need residents to abide by the following:

Dumpsters – DO NOT DUMP

- Stumps, tree limbs, or yard waste. Alternatives are the green waste area in Brigham City or obtain a residential burn permit. The Box Elder County landfill also offers Pay Once on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Saturdays of every month for public NON-WEIGHABLE loads only. Call 435-744-2275 for hours and more information or go the Box Elder County website: www.boxeldercounty.org .
- Concrete or construction debris
- Hazardous waste

BURN PERMIT INFORMATION

Burn Permits - NO BURN PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED UNLESS THE CLEARING INDEX IS ABOVE 500 for Airshed 4. Links to check the index are available at www.willardcity.com . The Division of Air Quality regulates this, not the County Fire Marshal. If the Burn Index is not above 500 on the day you want to burn do not call for a burn permit.

- **Agricultural Burn Permits** - Agriculture burning falls into a little different category and permits can be issued year round, ONLY if the [Clearing Index](#) is above 500 for Airshed 4. In order to qualify for

UDOT- Hwy 89 and 750 North Project

UDOT has a project planned to install a stoplight and turning lanes at 750 North and Hwy 89 in 2018. They will also be resurfacing Hwy 89. The final engineering is being completed and the project will be put out for bid.

We are fast approaching road construction season all over!!!! Please use caution around construction and SLOW DOWN for the safety of construction workers. We will forward more information as it becomes available to us.

an agriculture burn permit, you must be burning natural vegetation, ie: fruit tree pruning, ditch banks and stubble fields, you must be farming as a livelihood, and your property must be in the greenbelt for taxes. If you meet the criteria for Agricultural Burn Permits and the Clearing Index is above 500 for Airshed 4 call 435-734-3345. Burn Permits for Saturday will be issued on Friday and there is no burning on Sunday.

- **Residential Burn Permits** - The "Residential Burn Windows" are March 30- May 30 and September 15- October 30. Burn permits can ONLY BE ISSUED IF THE Clearing Index is above 500 for Airshed 4. State requirements limit burning for only natural vegetation, ie: tree trimmings, leaves, etc., can be burned. This means no construction debris, household garbage, tires, etc. can be burned. Other methods of disposal will need to be used for these items. If the date is between the Residential Burn windows and the index is above 500 for Airshed 4 call 435-734-3345. Burn Permits for Saturday will be issued on Friday but you will have to check the Clearing Index before you start burning on Saturday and there is no burning on Sunday.

Streets and Water-

○ **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.

○ **Water** – Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access.



Protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? . Planning on putting in a sprinkler system. Doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Help protect our water. ○ **Sewer**- Property owners are responsible for the sewer clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and breaking off.

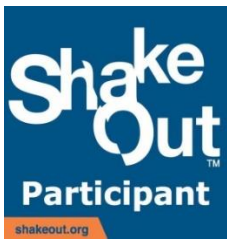
Police

○ **Dogs** – All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs. Spring is the time the Police Department gets dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to "do their business", clean up after them.

○ **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.

○ **Scams** –There is always an increase in reported scams regarding the IRS this time of year. **DO NOT** give out personal information over the phone to anyone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not send personal information by email even when they appear to come from a friend's email.

On the morning of **Thursday, April 19, at 10:15 a.m.** - no matter where you are - no matter what you are doing – **PRACTICE DROP, COVER and HOLD ON.** (Unless you are driving in a vehicle- then just talk/think about what you would do if an EQ were happening at that moment). Also, sometime during the day (prior to 4 PM) place any one of the colored cards from your Family "Take Action" packet in a visible window or door of your home.

As City Leaders, we encourage you, your family, your work place, your school, etc. to plan to participate in the State wide "**Drop, Cover and Hold On**"!!!! Great Utah Shake Out activity scheduled for that morning.

We ask that each of us take this opportunity to practice. We encourage you to think about and discuss what you would do for yourselves, families and others around you *before, during* and *after* an event such as an earth quake (or any other disaster). Are you prepared to take the actions you discussed? The better prepared we are *prior* to any event, the better we will be able to handle the *during* and *after* effects of any situation.

I hope that you will plan to take part as a CERT Team member in the Willard City/Community activities that will be on going during the day of the Great Utah Shake Out. THURSDAY, APRIL 19TH, 2018

Participating in the activities allow us an excellent opportunity to Practice and Test our CERT Phone Tree, our FRS and HAM Radio Communication Networks, as well as our ability to respond and participate in hands-on scenarios.

All CERT members are encouraged to respond and participate in all of the activities.

What's Happening and When:

Morning:

9:00 AM – CERT Phone Tree activated. Calling Captains will be trying to make a personal phone/text contact with every CERT member. Please help by getting updated phone/text/email info to your Captain.

10:15 AM – Wherever you are - Participate in the **Drop, Cover and Hold On** activity. Talk about what you would do if you were in your current location during a real earthquake.

NOON: FRS radio check-in. Use main Channel 9, sub-channel 11. Follow Standard Operating Guidelines for practice drills. (Relay if possible) (S.O. Guidelines were e-mailed to all CERT members with current email addresses.)

NOON: HAM Radio Operators will check-in with Blake (KF7LHC) using SIMPLEX frequency 145.700. Blake will act as Net Control for the Noon check-in. Relay as needed. Dave J. (N7JWY) will also be monitoring.

Evening:

(6:00 PM – Willard LDS STAKE Emergency Communication Network will be available to take **WARD AREA** check-ins. Blake (KF7LHC) will be acting as Net Control. Use SIMPLEX frequency 145.700

7:00 PM ** Turn on FRS & HAM Radios at 7 PM - report in, talk and monitor until 8:30 PM.

FRS Radio Operators – Report to JO B. (or other relay personnel) **Channels: 9 – 11**

HAM Operators – Use Simplex Frequency 146.440. Dave J. (N7JWY) will be Net Control for the night practice. (Relay as needed) Glen (KE7JUI) will also be monitoring. FRS and HAM nets will be left "open" and be monitored until 8:30 PM. (Unless needed for actual emergency situations.)

Use this time to practice using your radios.....

ALL CERT Members: Respond to Willard City Hall beginning at 7:00 PM. Dress in CERT Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) and bring your CERT bag and gear. Bring charged FRS radios. Response activity stations will be setup for hands-on refresher practice. These practice stations will be "open" till 8:30 pm.

The CERT STORE will be open from 7 to 8:30 PM at Willard City Hall. Restock your CERT kit, pick-up needed emergency prep supplies or 72 Hour Kit items. Lois will have everything well stocked and ready.

RED FILE folders will be available to purchase. \$10 each Family "**Take Action**" Packets will be available.

Everyone welcome at the CERT Store! Encourage family, neighbors, friends to come and check out the supplies!

Join us to celebrate over 100 miles of safe, separated, and connected multi-use trails linking Ogden and Provo on Saturday, June 2.

The Wasatch Front Regional Council, in partnership with the Utah Department of Transportation; Utah Transit Authority; Bike Utah; Jordan River Commission; Mountainland Association of Governments; Utah Department of Health; Utah Governor's Office of Outdoor Recreation; and Davis, Salt Lake, and Weber counties, invites you to participate in a group bike ride and family-friendly event to celebrate the completion of the Golden Spoke network. The Golden Spoke consists of over 100 miles of safe, separated, and connected multi-use trails, including [Ogden River Parkway](#), [Denver and Rio Grande Western Rail Trail](#) (funded gap), [Legacy Trail](#), [Jordan River Trail](#), [Murdock Canal Trail](#), and [Provo River Parkway](#), and links Ogden and Provo.

This free event includes two simultaneous group bike rides. One ride begins at Rainbow Gardens in Ogden Canyon and travels south (approximately 46 miles), while a second ride begins at Palisade Park in Orem and travels north (approximately 51 miles). The two group bike rides will converge in the center of the connected trails at the new Jordan River Bridge near North Temple in Salt Lake City. Community members will have the opportunity to join at multiple points along the trails for a shorter ride, run, or walk. Additionally, there will be community events hosted along the way, as well as a final celebration at 1:30 pm near the Jordan River Bridge (exact location to be determined), which will include guest speakers and family-friendly activities.
