Effective immediately residents are asked to follow the following water schedule:

- Odd house numbers - water on odd numbered days.
- Even house numbers - water on even numbered days.
- No watering on the 31st.
- Do not water between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Water Conservation

For water conservation tips go to www.waterwiseutah.org . Many areas in the West are suffering from drought situations. If you have had an opportunity to travel around the northern part of the State, you would see that many of the reservoirs are extremely low. We must each do our part in conserving this precious resource.

Water meters – Most of the water meters are radio read meters. It is important that the meter remain accessible in case an emergency shut off is needed. One of our residents returned from vacation to a basement full of water. The meter was covered by dirt and it took extra time to locate the meter and get the water turned off. If you need your meter turned off, for any reason, please contact the City Office or for after-hours emergencies call 435-734-3800.

Sewer service lines & clean outs – A reminder to watch out what you put down your drains and toilets. Things like diapers (yes there have been some), feminine products, etc. can cause a backup. This is not pleasant for anyone. If it is caught in the service line (between your house and the main line) you will be responsible for cleanup and repairs. Make sure cleanouts are accessible and have caps. They need to be at ground level or protected if they are above ground level.

Irrigation water - Residents that have irrigation water are responsible for keeping the water contained on their property. If you have problems contact the ditch master listed on your schedule.

Streets

Please clear branches, yard waste, piles of rocks and dirt from the city right-of-ways. The City Maintenance Department has been unable to maintain some areas because of debris.

We are also asking for your help to watch out for those illegally dumping trash along 200 West (Bamberger).

CERT Training

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encourage to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. We encourage every household to have at least one CERT trained family member.
