DEPARTMENTS

- o **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for summer maintenance. **Do not** place rocks in the city right of way from the pavement to the property line.
- o **Water** – Protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system? Doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Help protect our water. - o **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from your home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level, capped, and protected to avoid pipes from breaking of and debris from causing costly back-ups into your house.
- o **Dogs: All dogs** over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. To license your dog we need proof of current rabies vaccinations and proof of spay or neutering. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence.
- o **Parks** If you take your dogs for a walk to the park, including the Nature Park or along the streets to “do their business” please do your part and clean up after them. Let’s keep Willard beautiful! Any owner caught with their dog off leash or “running at large” will be issued a citation. When walking along the trail or in the mountains **be rattlesnake aware** they are known to sun themselves on the warm/hot rocks and asphalt.
- o **Lock your Vehicles** – There are still reports of items being taken from vehicles. There has also been an increase in trailer thefts along the Wasatch Front please take the time to put locks on trailers. Report any suspicious activity as soon as possible.
- o **Speed Limits** – Speed limits on all streets in Willard is 25 mph unless posted otherwise. We have received numerous complaints of speeders on 200 West.
- o **Fire Danger** – With the dry hot weather we have been having please use extreme caution with motorized vehicles (lawn mowers, weed eaters, ATV’s etc) around dry grass. Even a skip of a rock can spark a fire on dry material.

SR-315 North Marina to US 89 Project

UDOT will be conducting a maintenance improvement project beginning Monday August 3 through August 28 from 7:00 am-7:00 pm M-F. This project includes mill and overlay, asphalt paving, chip seal, shoulder work, striping and signage. Crews will work to minimize impacts to local residents, business and travelers. No road closures will occur during construction, however flaggers will control traffic so expected delays. We're Going Back To School

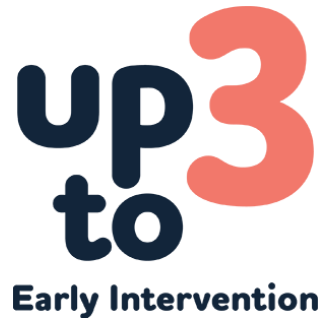

Water Wise Welcome to Utah Summer Heat

- Don't water in the middle of a hot day. Watering when its cooler allows water to penetrate into the root zone where it can be helpful to the plant. A good rule-of-thumb is to not water between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm.
- Water deeply. Deep soak your lawn's root zone where the water won't evaporate as quickly and will do the most good for the plant. By using a soil probe (or even a screwdriver), you can determine if your soil is moist in the root zone, and if you need to water. If it's moist, don't water!
- Don't over water. Excess watering means that fertilizers and pesticides will move out of the root zone of the plant, rendering them ineffective. What's worse, is that those toxins can penetrate into the groundwater, impacting water quality and increasing the environmental burden.
- Avoid watering on windy or rainy days. If it's windy, wait a day. If it's rainy, wait a day. Don't water in adverse weather.
- Put soup cans out on your lawn and determine how much time it takes to put 1 inch of water on the ground.
- Avoid watering the entire lawn for the few brown or dry patches.
