GARBAGE PICK UP



Just a note from our garbage hauler Econo-Waste – Please do not **overload** garbage containers. If the lid on the container is open more than 2 inches, it is considered overloaded, do not put bags or boxes outside the container. Dumping overloaded containers causes messes that our drivers do not have time to clean up. It is also difficult to grab a container that is surrounded by excess waste and boxes without making a mess as well. We would like to help keep your city as clean and sanitary as possible, so please let residents know that if their waste does not fit into their container, we politely ask that they contact the City to order another one.

Please remind residents that ashes should **NEVER** be placed in any waste container. Even if it seems like the ashes have burned out, they can possibly re-light as a container is dumped and exposed to the wind and air. This is a huge concern for us, as it could potentially cause serious damage to our equipment and can put our drivers in danger.

Important Announcements

Please remove vehicles, trailers, and other equipment from City Streets and right of ways to allow safe plowing of snow.



Snow Parking???



Chief Loveland would like residents to help by voluntarily moving vehicles, trailers, etc. from the City right-of-way to aid in snow removal. City Code 10-340 (B) states: "It is unlawful to park a vehicle on a street at any time when such parking shall interfere with the City's efforts to remove snow from City streets or any other public works activities which requires the removal of vehicles from the street. Any such vehicle is declared to be a public nuisance." We are concerned for the



safety of our snow plow drivers and want to avoid damaging the City equipment and your property. If the snow cannot be pushed off the asphalt it melts across the road and freezes during the cold nighttime hours. This causes hazardous conditions for drivers and pedestrians. **Do not plow the snow from your driveway into the streets** as it freezes and damages the snow plows as well as creates a hazard for motorists and pedestrians. It is also a violation of City Code! **If necessary vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.** Please remove **garbage cans from the street as soon as possible after they have been dumped to help with snow removal.**

WINTER DRIVING

A reminder to check your tires to make sure they have adequate tread. Please make sure to remove snow and frost from all windows to have a clear view of the road. Make sure windshield wipers are in good working order and check the windshield washer fluid. Deer are also migrating across Highway 89. Please keep an eye out for them in both the daytime and nighttime. Texting while driving is illegal and talking on your phone while driving is also distracting. Please slow down and keep both eyes on the road. Many of our Police Officers and Emergency Responders have nearly been hit by vehicles while responding to accidents. Slow down and move over for emergency vehicles.



Christmas is prime time for thefts. Don't leave valuables (Christmas presents, purses, computers, cell phones) in your vehicles, lock your vehicles and house doors. Do not start vehicles and leave them running to warm up. If you see suspicious vehicles or individuals in the area, report it **immediately.**

Chief Loveland would rather check things out and avoid such incidents. Call BE County dispatch at 435-734-3800 option 0 for non-emergencies and 911 if it is an emergency.

❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

- **Water** –Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.
- **Streets** – Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road.
