Dog Licensing – Dog licenses are now overdue and a \$5.00 late fee is now added to the cost of the license. Owners for dogs licensed in 2016 were sent a postcard in November. Please contact us if you no longer have your dog or dog has passed away so it can be removed from our list.



Business Licenses -Business licenses also expired on December 31, 2016. Reminders were sent to 2016 licensed businesses. Business licenses are required for anyone doing business within the Willard City limits. If you have any questions, contact the City Offices at 734-9881.

❖ **Streets and Water-** Winter is here and we have experienced snow and now cold temperatures.

- **Streets** – I think we have all had about enough winter, but the first day of spring is not until March 20. Hang on we still have more to come. Please look for the fire hydrant closest to your house. Is it clear? If not help by clearing around the hydrant as the picture shows. Seconds count in a fire. As for plowing please move trailers, garbage containers as quickly after pick-up as possible, and vehicles from the sides of the streets to avoid damage and to allow the snow plows to move the snow as far off the pavement as possible. Do not plow snow from driveways into the street as it freezes and creates a danger for other motorists.



- **Water** – The temperature has dropped and we experienced a number of days below freezing. Even as the temperature rises above freezing be aware of the possibility of frozen water lines. A slow drip is all it takes to keep your lines flowing. This is especially important if your meter or water line is in an area that is shaded.
- **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off.

❖ Police

- **Winter Driving** –Our Police Chief Loveland again reminds motorists to slow down and take extra time. Even when it might not appear to be bad outside, conditions can quickly change Make sure **all** of your windows are cleared of snow and ice. Check windshield wipers and fluid beforehand to make sure they are functioning properly and check your tires to make sure they have adequate tread on them. Locate your insurance cards and registration and make sure they are accessible in your vehicle in case of an unfortunate incident. Also watch for deer as they come down in search of food.
- **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in plain sight in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.



CERT Training:

CERT - It's never too early to plan for emergencies, but it is all too often too late. CERT Classes are scheduled to begin February 22, 2017. This will be the full training. The dates for classes are February 22, 25, 28, March 2 & 4. Weekday classes are from 6:00 pm -9:30 pm and Saturday classes are from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm. This is great information to help your family become prepared when an emergency hits. An emergency can be as little as the power being out for more than a couple of hours or the water turned off because of a line break to a major disaster such as an earthquake. Are you prepared??? NOTICE OF ELECTIONS

Notice is hereby given that Willard City will be holding a Municipal Election on November 7, 2017. Positions available are: Mayor and (2) City Council Positions - each are 4 year terms. Declarations of Candidacy will be accepted beginning June 1, 2017.

20A-9-203. Declarations of candidacy -- Municipal general elections.

(1)(a)(i) A person may become a candidate for any municipal office if:

- (A) the person is a registered voter; and
- (B)(I) the person has resided within the municipality in which that person seeks to hold elective office for the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election; or
- (II) if the territory in which the person resides was annexed into the municipality, the person has resided within the annexed territory or the municipality the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election.

(ii) For purposes of determining whether a person meets the residency requirement of Subsection (1)(a)(i)(B)(I) in a municipality that was incorporated less than 12 months before the election, the municipality shall be considered to have been incorporated 12 months before the date of the election.

(b) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (1)(a), each candidate for a municipal council position shall, if elected from a district, be a resident of the council district from which elected.

(c) In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored under Section 20A-2-101.3 or 20A-2-101.5. Declarations of Candidacy must be filed in person with the City Recorder during office hours 8 am to 5 pm, June 1, 2017 through June 7, 2017 (excluding Saturday and Sunday).
