RABIES CLINIC **SATURDAY – JANUARY 9, 2016** **10 AM-NOON**

Rabies Clinic - For the convenience of the residents Willard City will hold a rabies clinic. The clinic is scheduled for Saturday, January 9, 2016, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon at the Fire Station. Licenses will also be available on that day.

Dog Licensing -It is time to renew licenses. Licenses must be renewed by January 31, 2016 to avoid late fees. The cost of a license is \$5.00 for dogs that are spayed or neutered and \$15.00 for those that are not. Please contact us if you no longer have your dog or dog has passed away so it can be removed from our list.



Business Licenses -Business licenses also expired on December 31, 2015. Reminders were sent to 2015 licensed businesses. Business licenses are required for anyone doing business within the Willard City limits. If you have any questions, contact the City Offices at 734-9881.

RECYCLING - We appreciate all those individuals who use the paper recycling bins to recycle household and cardboard. The bins are available for the convenience of residents. While the carrier has a regular schedule for dumping, there are times when weather and holidays affect that schedule. We appreciate your patience when this happens and ask residents to remember the following:

Acceptable recycling items include newspaper, phonebooks, office paper, cardboard, cereal boxes, magazines, brown paper bags and construction paper. Break down boxes so more can be placed in the bin and make sure the bin lids are closed. If the paper or cardboard gets wet it is unusable. **DO NOT DUMP OUTSIDE OF THE BINS!!!!**

Unacceptable items include glass, metal, plastic bottles and bags, aluminum, string and Styrofoam. After Christmas there was a lot of Styrofoam, foam packing, and plastic. This is unusable and we do not get credit for the load.

UDOT I-15 Project-This Spring Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) will begin adding a third lane to I-15 from Farr West to Brigham City. Residents can expect an increase in traffic and especially truck traffic. DEPARTMENTS

- ❖ **Streets and Water-** Winter is here and we have experienced snow and cold temperatures.
 - **Streets** – The snow plows have been rolling. Residents are asked to move trailers, garbage containers as quickly after pick-up as possible, and vehicles from the sides of the streets to avoid damage and to allow the snow plows to move the snow as far off the pavement as possible. Do not plow snow from driveways into the street as it freezes and creates a danger for other motorists.
 - **Water** – The temperature has dropped and we experienced a number of days below freezing. Even as the temperature rises above freezing be aware of the possibility of frozen water lines. A slow drip is all it takes to keep your lines flowing. This is especially important if your meter or water line is in an area that is shaded.
 - **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off.

- ❖ **Police**

- **Winter Driving** – Box Elder had 4 fatalities on its roads between Christmas and New Year's Day. Our Police Chief and Police Officers urge, beg and plead for motorists Slow Down!!! Even when it might not appear to be bad outside, conditions can quickly change. Allow extra time for travel. Make sure **all** of your windows are cleared of snow and ice. Check windshield wipers beforehand to make sure they are functioning properly and check your tires to make sure they have adequate tread on them. Locate your insurance cards and registration and make sure they are accessible in your vehicle in case of an unfortunate incident. Also watch for deer as they come down in search of food.
- **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in plain sight in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency. The officers would rather be safe than sorry. Also call when it is happening. The Police Department often hears about information being shared on social media days after something occurs and valuable details are lost.
