Residents Beware!!!



If you have watched the news or read the paper lately, you have seen there have been a number of incidents in neighboring communities. **Even worse it is happening here!!!!** There have been reports of attempted break-ins in the early morning hours on the east side of town, while the residents are at home! There has also been suspicious activity all

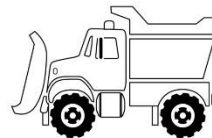
over town. **LOCK YOUR DOORS.** If you hear and/or see someone around your house at night – dial 911. Watch during the day for unusual activity or vehicles in your neighborhood. Get description of vehicles –make, model and color, and a license number if possible. Cell phone photos or videos are great too. If you have video surveillance watch for unusual activity and report it to the Police Department. Don't leave valuables in your vehicles and lock your vehicle and house doors. If you see a suspicious vehicle or individual in the area, report it **immediately (at once, right away, instantly, now, directly, promptly, forthwith, this/that (very) minute, this/that instant, there and then, then and there, on the spot, here and now, without delay, without further ado, posthaste;).** Many have been called in hours or days after the event. Chief Loveland would rather check things out and avoid such incidents.

Dog Licenses

For the convenience of our residents, a **rabies clinic** is scheduled January 6, 2018, from 10:00 a.m. to noon at the fire station. Vaccinations are offered at a reduced cost. Licenses will also be available and renewals are due by January 31, 2018.

Snow Parking???

Chief Loveland would like resident to help by voluntarily moving vehicles, trailers, etc. from the City right-of-way to aid in snow removal. City Code 10-318 (2) states: "It is unlawful to park a vehicle on a street at any time when such parking shall interfere with the City's efforts to remove snow from City streets or any other public works activities which requires the removal of vehicles from the street. Any such vehicle is declared to be a public nuisance." We are concerned for the safety of our snow plow drivers and



want to avoid damaging the City equipment and your property. If the snow cannot be pushed off the asphalt it melts across the road and freezes during

the cold nighttime hours. This causes hazardous conditions for drivers and pedestrians. **If necessary vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.**

WINTER DRIVING

We've had our first taste of winter driving. Please make sure to remove snow and frost from all windows to have a clear view of the road. Make sure windshield wipers are in good working order and check the windshield washer fluid. Deer and turkeys are migrating across Highway 89. Please keep an eye out for them in both the daytime and nighttime. Texting while driving is illegal and talking on your phone while driving is also distracting. Please slow down and keep both eyes on the road. Many of our Police Officers and Emergency Responders have nearly been hit by vehicles while responding to accidents. Slow down and move over for emergency vehicles.

❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

○ Water –

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.

○ **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can cause costly backups of sewage into your home.

○ **Streets –** Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. Do not plow the snow from your driveway into the streets as it freezes and damages the snow plows as well as creates a hazard for motorists and pedestrians. It is also a violation of City Code!
