Here are some great New Year's resolutions

1. **Check and test your smoke/carbon monoxide detectors.** Do they work? If not, get them replaced – NOW! If you do not have any, get some – NOW!
2. **Check the tires, lights and windshield wipers on your vehicle.** Do the tires have enough tread? Get a safety inspection even if it is not required. Also make sure current registration and insurance information is in the vehicle.
3. **Check to see if your address visible from the street.** Drive by your house and look how quickly you can find it, but remember you know where it is.

Garbage pick-up- new route!!!

Econo Waste, our garbage hauler, has notified us a new driver has taken over the route in Willard. The new driver is starting on the West side of town instead of the East. This change has begun and there have been some challenges. Please have your garbage out on Sunday night. If dogs in the area are a nuisance by getting into the garbage containers, please report them to Box Elder Co. Dispatch at 435-734-3800 (option 0). Please remember to keep cans at least 8 ft. apart and do not overfill the cans (lid open more than 2 inches). We appreciate your patience as we all work through this change.

Dog Licenses

For the convenience of our residents, a **rabies clinic** is scheduled January 5, 2019, from 10:00 a.m. to noon at the fire station. Vaccinations are offered at a reduced cost. Licenses will also be available and renewals are due by January 31, 2019. A reminder Willard Ordinance allows a maximum of 3 dogs are allowed per residence.

Business license renewal notifications have been sent out. Business licenses are to be renewed by January 31, 2019.

Chief Loveland reminds residents that it is illegal to shoot firearms in City limits.

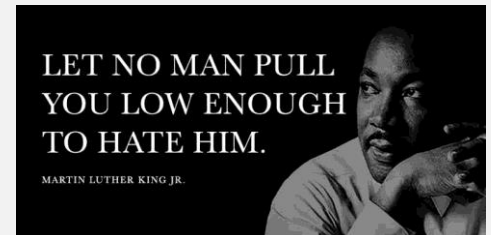

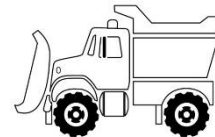

Snow Parking???



Chief Loveland would like resident to help by voluntarily moving vehicles, trailers, etc. from the City right-of-way to aid in snow removal. City Code 10-318 (2) states: "It is unlawful to park a vehicle on a street at any time when such parking shall interfere with



the City's efforts to remove snow from City streets or any other public works activities which requires the removal of vehicles from the street. Any such vehicle is declared to be a public nuisance." We are concerned for the safety of our snow plow drivers and want to avoid damaging the City equipment and your property. If the snow cannot be pushed off the asphalt it melts across the road and freezes during the cold nighttime hours. This causes hazardous conditions for drivers and pedestrians. **If necessary vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.** **DO NOT PLOW SNOW FROM YOUR DRIVEWAY INTO THE STREET AND PLEASE REMOVE GARBAGE CANS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.**

❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

○ Water –

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.

○ **Sewer**- Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can cause costly backups of sewage into your home.

○ **Streets** – Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. Do not plow the snow from your driveway into the streets as it freezes and damages the snow plows as well as creates a hazard for motorists and pedestrians. It is also a violation of City Code!

The Chief also reminds residents once again to call dispatch 435-734-3800 Option 0 (or 911 if it is an emergency) to report thefts, request VIN verifications, or any other reason you need a police officer to respond. City office personnel do not have direct contact with the officers.
