- ❖ **Call When It Happens** – Chief Loveland has received a number of reports of incidents days after they have occurred. If you see something suspicious or illegal activity contact Box Elder County Dispatch at 435-723-6890 or 911 if it is an emergency –WHEN IT IS HAPPENING.
- ❖ **Keep doors locked and garage doors shut** – Warm weather also is the time when the police departments see an increase in thefts. Lock car doors and lock your house when you leave. Don't leave items in plain sight such as change, purses and electronics. Also make sure trailers hitches and doors are locked. Keep garage doors shut so possible thieves can't take inventory as they drive by.
- ❖ **Drive Safely** – Box Elder County has had a number of fatal or near fatal accidents already this year. **Please** slow down, avoid distractions such as cell phones when driving, and pay attention to the traffic in front of you. A number of secondary accidents happen by not allowing the proper distance. Also watch for the
