Notice is hereby given that Willard City will be holding a Municipal Election on November 5, 2019. The election will be for the following positions: Three (3) City Council Member positions –each are 4 year terms.

Declarations of Candidacy will be accepted beginning Monday, June 3, 2019. Declarations of Candidacy or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with the City Recorder at the Willard City Offices 80 W. 50 S. during office hours 8 am to 5 pm, June 1, 2019 through June 7, 2019 (excluding Saturday and Sunday). Individuals located outside of the state during the entire filing period may file remotely or through a designated agent in accordance with UCA 20A-9-203. For candidate eligibility and residency requirements for elected municipal office see UCA 10-3-301.

rocks into the ponds as they clog up the grates. Also please do not drop off any animals (ducks, geese, turtles etc.) at the ponds. If they are domestic animals they have no way to survive the different seasons and frozen pond.

ATV's and OHV's



Safe??? -NO

ATV's and OHV's are becoming more and more popular. The headlines are now filled with accidents forever changing families' lives. There have also been complaints of ATV and OHV operators not following basic laws. Here are some of the basic laws.

Basic OHV Laws and Rules:

- **Wear Your Helmet:** For riders and passengers under age 18, it's the law, but we advise everyone to wear a helmet. It can save your life. Properly worn, a helmet won't reduce vision or hearing and helps cut out windblast.
- Gloves, abrasion resistant clothing, and over the ankle boots are also highly recommended
- Youth, 8-15 years of age, must possess an OHV education certificate before operating an OHV on public land
- Ride On Utah! – Ride only on designated routes and areas open to OHVs
- Ride on the right side of the road and in single file
- Be alert to oncoming traffic, especially on blind curves or in dips and crests of hills
- It is illegal to drive an OHV while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- A red or orange "whip flag" must be attached to OHVs when riding in sand dune areas
- Lights must be used between sunset and sunrise
- Be sure your brakes will control and stop your OHV
- Mufflers with an approved spark arrestor are required on all OHVs
- Individuals riding motorized scooters are also required to wear helmets and obey basic laws.
- **THE SPEED LIMIT ON CITY STREETS IS 25 MPH UNLESS POSTED OTHERWISE!**

Streets and Water-

○ **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.

○ **Water** – Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it is not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access.



BACKFLOW PREVENTION

You can help protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system or doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. ○ **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can cause costly backups of sewage into your home.

Police

○ **Dogs** – All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs. Spring/Summer is the time the Police Department gets dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to "do their business", clean up after them.

○ **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.

○ **Scams** –There is always an increase in reported scams regarding the IRS this time of year. **DO NOT** give out personal information over the phone to anyone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not send personal information by email or click on links even when they appear to come from a friend's email. Spring also brings out door-to- door sales people. Ask for their Willard City Solicitor's license. If they do not have one call Box Elder County Dispatch at 435-734-3800 and an officer will check them out. Some are very forward and if you feel threatened by the sales person call 911.
