Important Announcements

COVID -19 UPDATE: We are currently in the Yellow (low risk) phase of the Utah Leads Together 3.0 Plan for Health and Economic Recovery. Since going to yellow 3 weeks ago the Bear River Health District has seen a dramatic increase in the number of positive cases of COVID-19. We each need to be diligent in the practice of staying home when experiencing any of the COVID-19 symptoms, not congregating in crowds of more than 50, social distancing, wearing masks, washing hands and sanitizing surfaces so we to get back to the downward trend. We need to work together to protect those at higher risk for contracting the virus and avoid moving back to stronger restrictions.

FYI-Keep track of where you go and who you are in close contact with. If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 the Health Department needs to back trace to try and keep a handle on the spread.

Willard Nature Park - Keep Safe Stay Back!

Please use **extreme** caution while at the debris basin and other bodies of water. There is no swimming allowed at the Nature park. There are siphon tubes under the water and if you fall in the suction can cause you to become trapped under the water. Please refrain from throwing sticks and rocks into the ponds as they clog up the grates. Also please do not drop off any animals (ducks, geese, turtles etc.) at the ponds. If they are domestic animals they have no way to survive the different seasons.

NEW POST OFFICE BOX GUIDELINES



Starting August 1, 2020, all PO Box mail with the incorrect or missing PO Box number will be returned to sender as undeliverable as addressed or delivered to your curbside box if one is available. Please inform anyone corresponding with you to make sure they have the correct address. This includes utility companies and financial institutions etc. Mail can have both the street address and the PO Box number but PO Box number must be directly above

the city name. If you have any questions contact the Willard City Post Office at 435-723-5585.

Streets and Water-

- o **Streets**. Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.
- Water Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it is not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access.

BACKFLOW PREVENTION

You can help protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system or doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Sewer- Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can cause costly backups of sewage into your home.

Police

- Dogs All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs. Spring/Summer is the time the Police Department gets dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to "do their business", clean up after them.
- o **Lock your vehicles** Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.
- Scams -DO NOT give out personal information over the phone to anyone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not send personal information by email or click on links even when they appear to come from a friend's email. Spring also brings out door-to- door sales people. Ask for their Willard City Solicitor's license. If they do not have one call Box Elder County Dispatch at 435-734-3800 and an officer will check them out. Some are very forward and if you feel threatened by the sales person call 911.
