**Sewer Cleaning Project**

One of the requirements of maintaining a sewer system is periodic cleaning and having video taken of the insides of the collection lines to watch for blockages and groundwater infiltration. Willard City has contracted with Val Kotter & Sons to have this done. They will begin sometime in March. Some of the main lines run behind houses. **Dog Licensing** – All dogs must be licensed. The maximum number of dogs allowed per residence is 3. Kennel licenses are a conditional use in the A-5 zone and you must apply for a permit. The Police Department will be following up with the owners of dogs that have not renewed their licenses and dogs that are not licensed.



**Business Licenses** – Business licenses also expired on December 31, 2015. Reminders were sent to 2015 licensed businesses. Business licenses are required for anyone doing business within the Willard City limits. If you have any questions, contact the City Offices at 734-9881.

- **Streets** Please keep the City right-of-way clear of debris.
- **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.

**TO PATROL MAIN STREET AND ASK THAT RESIDENTS USE EXTREME CAUTION WHEN PULLING ON TO MAIN STREET.**

- **CATS** – The police department has received a number of complaints about cats. If you feed them please take care of them. Make sure they are spayed or neutered and clean up after them. Neighbors often don't share the love you might have of cats and certainly don't enjoy cleaning up after them.
- **Vehicle burglary** – Spring always brings an increase in calls for items stolen out of vehicles. Lock your vehicles, don't leave purses, bags, electronics, coins, personal information or other items in plain view.
- **OHV's (Off Highway Vehicles)** – The Police Department and the Division of Parks and Recreation held a training on OHV regulations. For those that did not attend these can be found by searching in your browser for Utah Code Annotated. These sections are:
  - 41-22-5.5 Off-highway husbandry vehicles.
  - 41-22-37 Off-highway vehicle operator responsibilities.
  - 41-22-10.3 Operation of vehicles on highways-Limits.
  - 41-22-10.1 Vehicles operated on posted public land.
  - 41-22-10.7 Vehicle equipment requirements –Rulemaking-Exceptions
  - 41-22-3 Registration of Vehicles –Application
  - 41-22-10.6 Requiring compliance with traffic laws
  - 41-22-10.8 Protective headgear requirements
  - 41-22-30 Supervision, safety certificate, or driver license required.
  - 41-8-1 Operation of vehicle by persons under 16 prohibited-Exceptions for off highway vehicles and off-highway implements of husbandry.

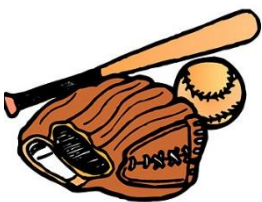
