Spring Run-off

Residents in Northern Box Elder County have already experienced flooding due to the higher than normal snow amounts we received this winter. Members of the awesome Willard City CERT team were activated to help fill sandbags and help with the many volunteers who have helped in the Elwood, Garland, and Tremonton areas. The bad news is, we haven't even hit the peak run-off season. The flooding hits different areas as the water table rises and with warmer temperatures the snowpack in the mountains will begin to melt. Don't try and drive through flooded areas and beware of fast moving rivers and streams, especially keeping kids and animals away. Irrigation Shares for Rent

Willard City has 120 shares (5 acres) of irrigation water for rent for the 2017 irrigation season. The shares are currently on Ditch 2 and the bidder is responsible to contact the Willard Water Company to make sure shares can be transferred for the season to the bidder's property. Sealed bids for the shares will be taken at the Willard City Office, 80 W 50 S, Willard, UT, until March 8, 2017, at 5:00 p.m. The minimum bid is \$95.00.

Hwy 89 widening Project – UPDATE: Information received from UDOT explained the widening of HWY 89 is for a bike lane along each side. Unfortunately the funding for the project will only allow it from the Box Elder/Weber County Line to 1800 ft. North of 7150 S in South Willard.

❖ Streets and Water-

- **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.
 - **Water** – Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access.
 - **Water Consumer Confidence Report** Each year the Willard City Water Department issues a report outlining the quality of the water system. The report for 2016 has been completed and is available on the City website or a copy can be requested at the Willard City Office – 80 W 50 S during regular hours M-F 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.

- **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and breaking off.

❖ Police

- **Dogs** – All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs.

Spring is the time the Police Department gets dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to “do their business”, clean up after them.

- **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.
- **Scams** –There is always an increase in reported scams regarding the IRS this time of year. DO NOT give out personal information over the phone to someone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not send personal information by email even when they appear to come from a friend's email.
