❖ **Streets and Water-**

- **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.
- **Water** – Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access.
- **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line, including sewer cleanouts. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and breaking off.



❖ **Police**

- **Dogs** – All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs and citations could be issued. Spring is the time the Police Department starts getting

Dominion Energy will continue construction of a new line that will go along 300 East in Willard. Residents need to be aware there will be some disruption in traffic during construction.

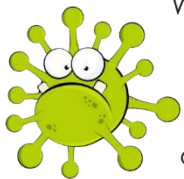
dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to “do their business”, clean up after them.

- o **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.
- o **Scams** –There is always an increase in reported scams regarding the IRS this time of year. DO NOT give out personal information over the phone to someone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not click on links or send personal information in emails you receive, even when they appear to come from a friend's email.

CERT Training: It's never too early to plan for emergencies, but it is all too often too late. CERT Classes are scheduled to begin in March. This will be the full training. The dates for classes are March 3, 5, 7, 10, 12 and 14. Weekday classes are from 6:00 pm -9:30 pm and Saturday classes are from 9:00 am –4:00 pm. There is a \$10.00 fee to cover the cost of materials. RSVP is highly recommended to ensure sufficient material and volunteers are available to hold the training. This is great information to help your family become prepared when an emergency hits. An emergency can be as little as the power being out for more than a couple of hours or the water turned off because of a line break to a major disaster such as an earthquake. Are you prepared???. - o **Coronavirus Information**



World events remind us of the importance of developing self-reliance skills to support ourselves, families and our communities. Enclosed with this newsletter is an Informational Flyer from our local Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and City Emergency Manager addressing the Coronavirus. In the event of any community level emergency, citizens will work closely with the CERT team to coordinate a response to resolve the emergency at hand. Many trained volunteers will be required to effectively respond as our traditional Government Response Team (Fire and Police Department) will immediately be overwhelmed in a widespread event.

ATV's and OHV's are becoming more and more popular. The headlines are now filled with accidents forever changing families' lives. There have also been complaints of ATV and OHV operators not following basic laws. Here are some of the basic laws.

Any OHV being operated or transported on public lands, roads or trails in the state of Utah must display a current OHV registration sticker. Dual sport off highway motorcycles may be registered as street legal vehicles if they possess the proper safety equipment, and carry the proper insurance or they may be registered as off-highway vehicles. All OHV registrations are handled by the Utah Division of Motor Vehicles.

No one under eight years of age is allowed to operate any OHV on public lands, roads or trails in Utah. Operators eight through 15 years of age may operate an OHV provided they possess an Education Certificate issued by Utah State Parks and Recreation or equivalent from their home state. Resident operators 16 years of age or older may operate an OHV if they possess either a valid driver's license or an approved OHV Education Certificate.

A properly fitting, safety rated helmet is the most important piece of safety gear to an OHV rider. Willard Police Dept. strongly encourages all riders to use helmets.

All youth riders under the age of 18 must be under the direct supervision of a person who is at least 18 years of age if operating on a public highway that is open to motor vehicle use and not reserved exclusively for off-highway vehicles. **Direct supervision is defined as at distance no more than 300 feet and within which visual contact is maintained and advice and assistance can be given and received.**
