COVID-19 UPDATE

Governor Herbert has issued the order to move from **HIGH RISK** to **MODERATE RISK** in phased guidelines of **Utah Leads Together 4.0** ([see here](#)). The **MODERATE RISK** comes with the following guidelines:

- Public follows Guidelines for All Levels of the General Public (outlined below) and employers follow General Guidelines for Employers (outlined below)
- General public and employers take extreme precautions
- Face coverings worn in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain
- In-person interactions limited to individual households and those who have been following recommended distancing/hygiene guidelines. Increase use of virtual interactions
- Leave home infrequently, stay 6 feet away from others when outside the home
- Interactions in decreased group sizes that enable all social distancing guidelines to be maintained; social interactions in groups of 20 or fewer
- Limit out-of-state travel, quarantine 14 days upon return from high-risk areas
- Schools closed
- Employees and volunteers of businesses operate remotely, unless not possible
- High-contact businesses can operate under strict protocols
- Restaurants are open for dine-in services with strict requirements
- Symptom checking in business interactions
- Employers evaluate workforce strategy, concerns, and enact strategies to minimize economic impact

City Covid-19 Update

We want to thank the residents who have complied with the directives of National, State, & County Officials. This has been a trying time for all of us. We will make it through this!

The City Council voted during their April 23rd first ever electronic meeting to waive late fees for the utility bills going out in May and June.

BURN PERMIT INFORMATION

Residential Burn Permits - The "Residential Burn Windows" are March 30- May 30 and September 15- October 30. Burn permits can ONLY BE ISSUED IF THE [Clearing Index](#) is above 500 for Airshed 4. State requirements limit burning to natural vegetation, ie: tree trimmings, leaves, etc. This means no construction debris, household garbage, tires, etc. can be burned. Other methods of disposal will need to be used for these items. If the date is between the Residential Burn windows and the index is above 500 for Airshed 4 call 435-734-3345. Burn Permits for Saturday will be issued on Friday but you will have to check the Clearing Index before you start burning on Saturday and there is no burning on Sunday.



YOUTH BASEBALL

Willard City Officials will continue to monitoring the Federal and State Directives and will comply accordingly. The City Council is still being optimistic and during their April 23, 2020 meeting voted to postpone the start until the first of June. They will monitor as businesses start opening up and restrictions lift to see if there are additional concerns. They will make a final decision later in May and if they choose to go forward a sign up period will be held the last week of May. If you have already signed up and want a refund, please email willardcity@comcast.net to request the refund. Please include the parent's name and the child's name so we can pull the registration sheet. Keep in mind that any decision made to delay or cancel will be in compliance with Federal, State and local Health Department directives to keep your children and family safe and healthy!

Streets and Water-

Streets. Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for spring maintenance along the sides the streets.

Water – Now is a good time to make sure there is clear access to your water meter. Make sure it not covered by dirt, debris, and trim bushes that block access. You can help protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system. Doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Help protect our water. Sewer- Property owners are responsible for the sewer clean-out from the home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and the pipe breaking off.

Police

- **Dogs** – All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence. The police department will be following up on unlicensed dogs. Spring is the time the Police Department gets dog complaints. Dogs are required to be on a leash when not on your property. If you take them for a walk to the park or along the streets to "do their business", clean up after them.
- **Lock your vehicles** - Make sure you lock your vehicle doors, even when your car is parked in your driveway and do not leave purses, electronics, cell phones or packages in your vehicle. Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhoods by calling Dispatch at 435-734-3800 for non-emergencies or call 911 if it is an emergency.
- **Scams** – **DO NOT** give out personal information over the phone to anyone who calls you or leaves a message for you to call back. Emails are another scam. Do not send personal information by email or click on links even when they appear to come from a friend's email. DO NOT update your email information from a link and beware of scams regarding the IRS or your stimulus check.
