- ❖ **Snow Removal** - It's that time of year when snow can hit. Please remove vehicles, garbage cans (as soon as possible) and debris on the city right-of-way. This will help avoid damage to property and allow for faster removal of snow on the city streets.
 - ❖ **Dog Licensing – PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR DOGS ARE LICENSED!!!!** The Police Department has been busy with calls on dogs running at large. Chief Loveland said they would rather take a dog home than to the shelter. It is time to renew licenses. The 2015 licenses are available now. Current licenses expire on December 31, 2014 and must be renewed by January 31, 2015. The cost of a license is \$5.00 for dogs that are spayed or neutered and \$15.00 for those that are not. A reminder postcard will be sent in the next couple of weeks to dog owners and will note whether proof of a rabies vaccination is needed.
Rabies Clinic - For the convenience of the residents Willard City will again be holding a rabies clinic. The clinic is scheduled for Saturday, January 10, 2015, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon at the Fire Station. Licenses will also be available on that day.
 - ❖ **Open House - Willard Creek Nature Park & Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project** – Willard City was awarded a \$903,132.39 Grant from the settlement of the Chevron pipeline break at Willard Bay for the project. A concept plan has been developed by Utah State University students and will be on display at an open house on November 13th at 5:30 pm at the City Hall. Come and see what is proposed.
 - ❖ **Business Licenses** -Business licenses also expire on December 31, 2013. Business licenses are required for anyone doing business within the Willard City limits. If you have a question, contact the City Offices at 734-9881.

SPEED LIMIT AND STOP SIGNS

There have been a number of complaints about excessive speed on City streets and drivers not stopping at stop signs. The speed limit, unless otherwise posted is **25 MPH**. The police department will be patrolling City streets and the speed limit and failure to stop at stop signs will be enforced. The minimum amount for a speeding citation is \$120.00
