WILLARD CREEK DEBRIS BASIN PARK

Many have noticed the addition of the bridge and paved walking trail in the Debris Basin area. We are excited about this new recreation area. The project; however, is not yet complete and there are safety issues that are being addressed. Caution tape, signs and blockades have been put on either side of the bridge for the safety of our citizens and mostly our children. Please leave them in place until they are removed by City Personnel after these safety measures have been put in place. The trail is available to walk and bicycle on. **No motorized vehicles** are allowed on the trail. The trail has **not been designed for motorcycles**, **side by sides**, **ATVs of any sort and especially cars and trucks**. These will damage the track and will result in costly repairs. Please report any motorized vehicles you see on the trails with a description of the vehicle and license plate if at all possible. This is going to be a great addition to our community and we ask that the citizens keep an eye out for those that are causing damage to it.

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.

- **Sewer** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.
- Streets Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. We hate to say the "s" word, but we do need to get ready for it!
