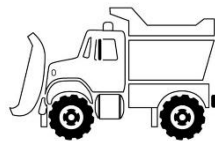
WILLARD COMMUNITY HALLOWEEN PARTY (TRUNK OR TREAT)

❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

○ Water –

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.

- **Sewer-** The Public Works Department personnel are doing their annual visual inspection of the sewer manholes. This is required annually to determine if there are any problem areas that could cause backups in the system. Some of the manholes are located in back yards and fields.

Residents are reminded not to flush diapers, needles, and other items that could cause potentially dangerous backups or damage to the system. The Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.

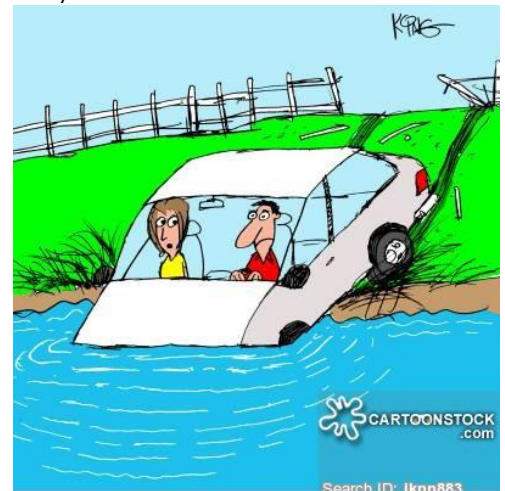
- **Streets –** Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. We hate to say the “s” word, but we do need to get ready for it!

❖ Police

- **Chief Loveland** reminds residents once again to call dispatch 435-734-3800 Option 0 (or 911 if it is an emergency) to report thefts, request VIN verifications, or any other reason you need a police officer to respond. City office personnel do not have direct contact with the officers.

Now is a good time to drive by your house and see how easy it is to spot the house numbers. House numbers need to be easy to read at the speed limit on the street. This could mean critical timing for emergency response. Even today’s technology can be wrong. Easy to read house numbers also help with pizza and package delivery.
