UDOT reports they are waiting for the lights and poles to arrive to complete the installation of the 750 N Main streetlight.

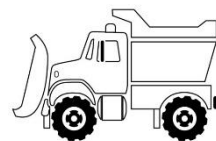

IT'S ON THE WAY!!!!

It is hard to believe we already need to prepare for snow. Please make sure vehicles, trailers, landscaping rocks, debris piles, etc. are not in the City right-of-way. This is for the safety of our drivers and will also avoid damaging the City equipment and your property. If the snow cannot be pushed off the asphalt it melts across the road and freezes during the cold nighttime hours. This causes hazardous conditions for drivers and pedestrians.

Some of you make it much easier than this!!! Many car thefts have been reported from people who have left purses, check books, wallets, electronics and other valuable items in plain sight in an unlocked vehicle. Please take these items out of your vehicles and lock the vehicle. Be sure and lock your house doors and report suspicious vehicles or individuals. Chief Loveland would rather check things out and avoid such incidents. Call BE County dispatch at 435-734-3800 option 0 for non-emergencies and 911 if it is an emergency.

The Police Department also wants to remind residents not to give out personal information over the phone unless it is a phone call you have made to a number you know and trust.

❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

○ Water –

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines.

- **Sewer-** The Public Works Department personnel have completed their annual visual inspection of the sewer manholes. This is required annually to determine if there are any problem areas that could cause backups in the system. They have reported the system looks good.

Residents are reminded not to flush diapers, needles, flushable wipes (check out this story <https://www.star-telegram.com/news/nation-world/national/article220093010.html>) and other items that could cause potentially dangerous backups or damage to the system. The property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.

- **Streets –** Please keep the City right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. We hate to say the “s” word, but we do need to get ready for it!

❖ Police

- **Chief Loveland** reminds residents once again to call dispatch 435-734-3800 Option 0 (or 911 if it is an emergency) to report thefts, request VIN verifications, or any other reason you need a police officer to respond. City office personnel do not have direct contact with the officers. Please drive by your residence to make sure house numbers are visible from the road.
