Some of you make it much easier than this!!! Many car thefts have been reported from people who have left purses, check books, wallets, electronics and other valuable items in plain sight in an unlocked vehicle. Please take these items out of your vehicles and lock the vehicle. Be sure and lock your house doors and report suspicious vehicles or individuals. Chief Fielding would rather check things out and avoid such incidents. Call BE County dispatch at 435-734-3800 option 0 for non-emergencies and 911 if it is an emergency.

## DEPARTMENTS

### ❖ Streets, Sewer and Water-

#### ○ Water –

Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency. If it begins to get below freezing for a period of time consider leaving a tap dripping to avoid frozen lines. **Pay attention to your water usage.** Average winter usage is 5,000-10,000 gallons per household. If your usage is going up during the winter months and you haven't had a lot of company, you may have a leak!

○ **Sewer** Residents are reminded not to flush diapers, needles, flushable wipes (check out this story <https://www.star-telegram.com/news/nation-world/national/article220093010.html>) and other items that could cause potentially dangerous backups or damage to the system. The property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line. Know what is going down your drain. Back-ups are messy and costly. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.

○ **Streets** – Please keep the City right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. We hate to say the “s” word, but we do need to get ready for it!

### ❖ Police

- **Chief Fielding** reminds residents once again to call dispatch 435-734-3800 Option 0 to report thefts that have past occurred, request VIN verifications, or any other reason you need a police officer to respond. City office personnel do not have direct contact with the officers. Call 911 if it is an emergency such as a fire or if you are in danger.
- **Do you have an address on your house?** Is it visible or large enough to be seen from the street during the day and illuminated at night? By not having readable numbers, this could delay emergency personnel in getting to you quickly. If you can't see your house numbers from the street, neither can emergency personnel.
