**Willard City Municipal General  
Election 2019.**

On Monday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, one of the candidates withdrew as a candidate for the election, leaving 3 candidates for 3 positions. UT Code 20 A-1-206 states: A municipal legislative body may cancel an election if: all the municipal officers are elected in an at-large election; and the number of municipal officer candidates, including any eligible write-in candidates, if any, does not exceed the number of open at-large municipal offices for which the candidates have filed. **The City Council will consider a Resolution during their October 10, 2019, meeting to cancel the election.**

## DEPARTMENTS

### ❖ Streets, Sewer, and Water-



- **Streets** - The snow season is coming upon us. Please pay attention to weather forecasts and remove trailers, vehicles, landscaping rocks, debris piles, etc. from the sides of the roads to allow the snow to be pushed as far off the asphalt as possible.
- **Speed Limits**- There has been several complaints about speeding along city streets especially along 200 West. **The speed limit on city streets is 25 mph** unless otherwise posted. **Slow down**, watch for kids riding bikes, skateboards or playing near the edges of roads. Watch out for maintenance personnel doing maintenance, reading meters etc. along city streets slow down and move over when lights are flashing. If there are road closed barricades up it means the road is closed to through traffic and you will need to find another way around. This is for the safety of those working on the street and the equipment they may be using.
- **Sewer**- Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the main line. This means you need to be careful of what goes down the drain. Backups are costly! Also, make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and debris falling into the line which can also cause back-ups. Public Works personnel will begin their annual manhole inspections. Please watch out for them and note that some are located in backyards and fields.
- **Water** – Water meters are the property of the City. If you are installing sprinkler systems or need the water turned off at the meter for any reason contact the City Office at 435-734-9881 or Dispatch 435-734-3800 for after-hours emergencies to have Water Department Personnel turn it off. This is to avoid costly damage to the meter itself. As the snow flies please make sure our meters are accessible in case of an emergency. As temperatures begin to fall be sure to properly winterize sprinkling systems to avoid broken lines and costly leaks. Also, pay attention to the usage on your water bill. Get a good idea of what your average usage is and compare it from month to month!

- ❖ **Burn Permits** – The Fall open burn period is from September 15 – October 30. Extremely dry conditions still exist, even with the rain we had! NO BURN PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED UNLESS THE CLEARING INDEX IS ABOVE 500 for Airshed 4. Links to check the index are available at [www.willardcity.com](http://www.willardcity.com) or by calling the Box Elder County Fire Marshal at 435-734-3345. The Division of Air Quality regulates this, not the County Fire Marshal. If the Burn Index is not above 500 on the day you want to burn do not call for a burn permit.

### ❖ Police

- **VEHICLE THEFTS – PLEASE DO NOT** leave your keys in the car or your vehicles unlocked. Put items away. Don't leave purses, bags, electronics, coins, personal information in your vehicle and if you do, don't leave them in plain view. Lock garages, trailers, storage sheds. Please report any suspicious activity in your neighborhood as soon as you notice it! The number to Box Elder County Dispatch is 435-734-3800 Option (0) for non-emergency calls. **If it is an emergency call 911.**
- **DOGS** – If you are a dog owner, license your dog, keep them on a leash when walking them, control barking- especially at night and clean up after them if they “do their business” anywhere that is not in your yard!
