DOMINION ENERGY GAS LINE

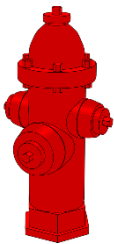

Eagle Scout Fire Hydrant Project



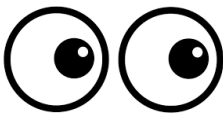
Over the next few weeks prospective Eagle Scouts and Fire Department members will be cleaning/clearing fire hydrants in preparation for paint. The Fire Chief has requested that all hydrants have a 6 ft. radius to help with locating each hydrant and to aid the hose connection in the event of an emergency. The body of the fire hydrants will be painted fire hydrant red, the hood may be painted a different color to indicate hose connection size and the knob on top may be painted another color to indicate line pressure. All of the color coded information is very important to our Fire Department in an emergency. They ask that you do not add to or change any of the colors on the hydrants. Care will be taken to keep existing landscape areas as intact as possible.

Departments

- **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for fall maintenance.
- **Water** – Protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system? Doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Help protect our water. - **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from your home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and breaking off.

Police

- **Dogs: All dogs** over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. To license your dog we need proof of rabies vaccinations and proof of spay or neutering if they have been. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence.
- **Parks** If you take your dogs for a walk to the park, including the Nature Park or along the streets to “do their business” please do your part and clean up after them. Let’s keep Willard beautiful! Any owner caught with their dog off leash or “running at large” will be issued a citation.
- **Lock your Vehicles** – There are still reports of items being taken from vehicles. There has also been an increase in trailer thefts along the Wasatch Front please take the time to put locks on trailers. Report any suspicious activity as soon as possible.
- **Speed Limits** – Speed limits on all streets in Willard is 25 mph unless posted otherwise. Please slow down when coming down off of the east bench.
- **Fraud calls are on the rise** – We have had several calls from citizens about phone calls they received from the IRS or Social Security Offices. Scammers sometimes pretend to be government officials to get you to send them money or give them personnel information. They might promise lottery winnings if you pay “taxes” or other fees, or they might threaten you with arrest or a lawsuit if you don’t pay a supposed debt. Regardless of their tactics, their goal is the same: to get you to send them money or give them personnel information. **DO NOT GIVE OUT PERSONNEL INFORMATION (THIS INCLUDES SOCIAL SECURITY, CREDIT CARDS OR CHECKING/SAVINGS ACCOUNT NUMBERS) OR SEND MONEY! JUST HANG UP!!!!** Federal government agencies and federal employees don’t ask people to send money for prizes or unpaid loans. Nor are they permitted to ask you to wire money or add money to a prepaid debit card to pay for anything. There’s no legitimate reason for someone to ask you to wire money or load a rechargeable money card as a way to pay back a debt. If you’re unsure whether the threat is legitimate, look up the official number for the government agency, office or employee and call to get the real story. Check out www.consumer.ftc.gov for more information on different types of scams that are out there. If it sounds too good to be true it generally is.
