EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Communication in the event of an emergency is also crucial. This past month we had two instances where Rocky Mountain Power replaced power poles and the interruption in service cut power to both of the City wells. RMP sent out calls about the interruption and a request for residents to conserve water was posted on the Willard Residents Facebook Page and a reverse 911 call was put out through the Box Elder County Sheriff's office. Many residents have eliminated their home phones and/or changed cellphone numbers. We ask you take a minute to register with CODE RED to be notified in case of an emergency. 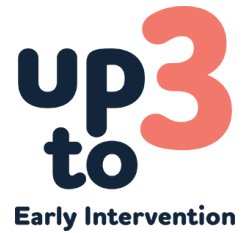

Departments

- **Streets.** Please clear debris from the sides of the roads to allow for maintenance in preparation for the white stuff☁.
- **Water** – Protect our water system. Do you know putting a hose in a pool and then shutting it off without taking it out of the pool can contaminate drinking water? Planning on putting in a sprinkler system? Doing outside watering? Visit our website www.willardcity.com for valuable information on how to avoid cross connection and for important backflow prevention information. Help protect our water. - **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from your home to the main line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid debris from causing costly back-ups into your house and breaking off.

Police

- **Dogs: All dogs** over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. To license your dog we need proof of rabies vaccinations and proof of spay or neutering if they have been. Willard City allows 3 dogs maximum per residence.
- **Parks** If you take your dogs for a walk to the park, including the Nature Park or along the streets to “do their business” please do your part and clean up after them. Let’s keep Willard beautiful! Any owner caught with their dog off leash or “running at large” will be issued a citation.
- **Lock your Vehicles** – There are still reports of items being taken from vehicles. There has also been an increase in trailer thefts along the Wasatch Front please take the time to put locks on trailers. Report any suspicious activity as soon as possible.
- **Speed Limits** – Speed limits on all streets in Willard is 25 mph unless posted otherwise. Please slow down when coming down off of the east bench. School is back in session please watch for kids going to and coming home from school and around bus stops.
- **Fraud calls are on the rise** – We have had several calls from citizens about phone calls they received from the IRS or Social Security Offices. Scammers sometimes pretend to be government officials to get you to send them money or give them personnel information. They might promise lottery winnings if you pay “taxes” or other fees, or they might threaten you with arrest or a lawsuit if you don’t pay a supposed debt. Regardless of their tactics, their goal is the same: to get you to send them money or give them personnel information. **DO NOT GIVE OUT PERSONNEL INFORMATION (THIS INCLUDES SOCIAL SECURITY, CREDIT CARDS OR CHECKING/SAVINGS ACCOUNT NUMBERS) OR SEND MONEY! JUST HANG UP!!!!** Federal government agencies and federal employees don’t ask people to send money for prizes or unpaid loans. Nor are they permitted to ask you to wire money or add money to a prepaid debit card to pay for anything. There’s no legitimate reason for someone to ask you to wire money or load a rechargeable money card as a way to pay back a debt. If you’re unsure whether the threat is legitimate, look up the official number for the government agency, office or employee and call to get the real story.
