❖ **Call When It Happens** – Chief Loveland has received a number of reports of incidents days after they have occurred. If you see something suspicious or illegal activity contact Box Elder County Dispatch at 435-723-6890 or 911 if it is an emergency –WHEN IT IS HAPPENING.

❖ **Door-to-Door** -Door-to-door salespeople are required to have a Willard City business license. If you ask them they may say yes because they have been licensed by the County or another community. It is ok to ask to see their license or you can call Box Elder County Dispatch at 435-734-3800 and an officer can check it out.

❖ **Fire Restrictions.** With the rain we received in May, followed by a record hot June the fire danger is extremely high. Fire restrictions are in place throughout the County. In Willard the area shown on the left has special restrictions. Please refer to the Willard website for the full ordinance or contact the City office for a copy.

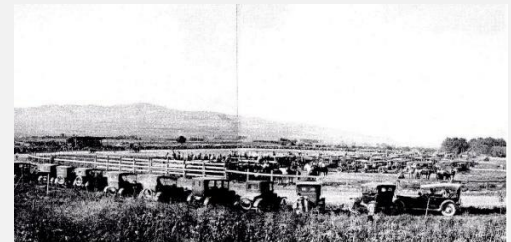
