There are new emphasis features within the CERT program. CERT instruction and certification requirements have changed.

It is our hope to keep pace with these changes. We are in the process of upgrading and improving our current CERT Training certification procedures. We want to insure that our Willard CERT Team is the greatest and best in the Country. (Okay, Okay - in the State). Because of these new procedures we will **NOT** be holding the regular CERT Basic Training classes this Fall. The Basic CERT course will be taught, as usual, in the Spring 2017.

The Willard Cemetery District Board is **prohibiting animals** in the **Willard Cemetery** – “No Animal” signs have been posted. They have tried to ask for voluntary compliance from individuals in cleaning up after their animals and keeping them on their leashes. Most have complied and the Board thanks those that have. A few have not. Some violators have even become angry and confrontational. Those visiting the cemetery have been met with unpleasant surprises on the graves of their loved ones. This has forced the Cemetery Board to make the decision. They appreciate your cooperation in their decision.

WILLARD CREEK DEBRIS BASIN PARK

Many have noticed the addition of the bridge and paved walking trail in the Debris Basin area. We are excited about this new recreation area. The project; however, is not yet complete and there are safety issues that are being addressed. Caution tape, signs and blockades have been put on either side of the bridge for the safety of our citizens and mostly our children. Please leave them in place until they are removed by City Personnel after these safety measures have been put in place. The trail is available to walk and bicycle on. **No motorized vehicles** are allowed on the trail. The trail has **not been designed for motorcycles, side by sides, ATVs of any sort and especially cars and trucks.** These will damage the track and will result in costly repairs. Please report any motorized vehicles you see on the trails with a description of the vehicle and license plate if at all possible. This is going to be a great addition to our community and we ask that the citizens keep an eye out for those that are causing damage to it.

BURN PERMITS

- ❖ **Burn Permits** - NO BURN PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED UNLESS THE CLEARING INDEX IS ABOVE 500 for Airshed 4. Links to check the index are available at www.willardcity.com or by calling the Box Elder County Fire Marshal at 435-734-3345. The Division of Air Quality regulates this, not the County Fire Marshal. If the Burn Index is not above 500 on the day you want to burn do not call for a burn permit.

DEPARTMENTS

- ❖ **Streets, Sewer and Water-**
 - **Water –**
Water Meters – The snow season is coming upon us. As the snow flies please make sure your meters are accessible in case of an emergency.
Secondary Water – As reported last month a representative from Pineview Water attended a recent City Council meeting. They are interested in putting in pressurized secondary water system in Willard City if there are enough residents interested. We are still working to get a questionnaire together to see if there is enough interest in secondary water. Watch in future newsletters for any updates on this subject.
 - **Sewer-** Property owners are responsible for the sewer line from the home to the clean out at or near the property line. Make sure sewer cleanouts are cut off at ground level and capped or protected to avoid breaking them off and protecting them from debris which can block the line.
 - **Streets –** Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. We hate to say the “s” word, but we do need to get ready for it!
- ❖ **Police**
 - **Chief Loveland** reminds residents once again to call dispatch 435-734-3800 Option 0 (or 911 if it is an emergency) to report thefts, request VIN verifications, or any other reason you need a police officer to respond. City office personnel do not have direct contact with the officers.
